

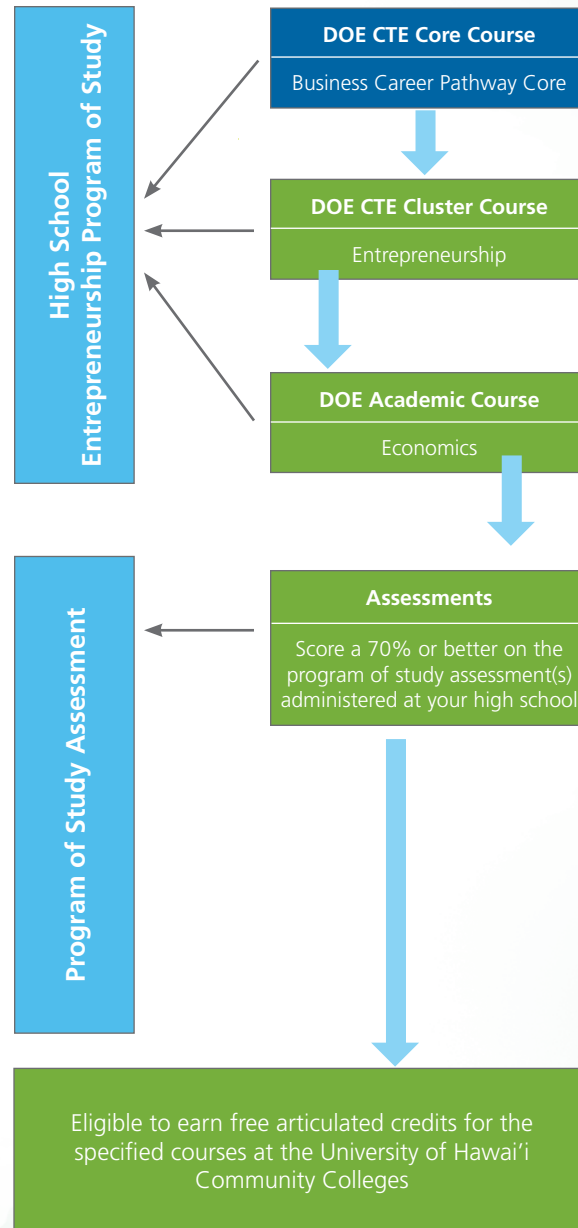
How Do I Receive The Free Community College credit?

- Decide which participating University of Hawai'i Community College to attend
- Earn acceptance into the Marketing, Management – Sales and Marketing, or Business Careers Program of Study at the participating college
- Contact the college counselor, program chair, or articulation coordinator at the college you wish to attend (ask your teacher for contact information)
- Have the official high school transcripts sent directly to the community college you wish to attend
- Apply for the dual credit within two (2) years from your high school graduation date

FAQs

How is the Dual Credit Articulated Program of Study (DCAPS) Entrepreneurship Program of Study different from other dual credit options such as the Running Start, Gear Up, or Advanced Placement?

- Students earn community college credit in classes taken on their high school campus and taught by high school teachers
- Students do not pay fees for the postsecondary credits
- Students do not pay administrative fees to have the credits posted to their postsecondary transcript

Dual Credit Articulated Program of Study

The Hawai'i Career Pathway System Dual Credit Articulated Program of Study (DCAPS) is a way for **high school students** who successfully master the Entrepreneurship Program of Study standards to earn free community college credit. Students in the Entrepreneurship Program of Study earn both high school and college credit through courses taken at their high schools.

Who is Eligible?

High school students who:

- Complete the high school Entrepreneurship Program of Study courses in the proper sequence
- Earn a grade of "C" or better in the Entrepreneurship Program of Study core and cluster courses and the required academic course, Economics
- Pass the required program of study assessment(s) with a minimum score(s) of 70%
- Earn a high school diploma

Students who successfully complete the Entrepreneurship Program of Study and pass the required assessments are eligible to receive community college credits in the following programs of study:
